

'We never felt judged'


We recently received this heartfelt message from "A Lincoln Mama." We wanted to share it with you. Dear Lincoln Food Bank,

We don't 'look' like we need help from the Food Bank (ok house, ok car, clothed decently) but recently a medical event wiped out our savings, took all our money that wasn't going to bills, and forced us to choose between food and medicine. Our credit card was maxed out after a month. We got food from the Food Bank distribution. It kept us fed during a really dark and trying time. 
